Riding in the "At Your Own Risk Area"

The self-responsibility area/hike-up course is outside the course. The boundary between the ski resort course and the outside of the course is defined by fences, ropes, poles, and remaining forest (clumps of trees).

- Risk is not managed by the resort in "At Your Own Risk Area"
- In "At Your Own Risk Area" There are various unexpected hazards such as avalanche terrain, rocks, cliffs, trees, stumps, artificial structures, avalanche debris and sudden changes in snow condition. Also search and rescue operations if available may be delayed
- Patrol will not provide outside of ski courses.
- If an incident occurs in "At Your Own Risk Area," and the ski patrol conducts search and rescue activities, Aomori Spring Ski Resort will charge the actual cost of the rescue to the person concerned.
